Public Meeting to Discuss Solihull's Core Strategy plans

The UDP is being replaced and consultation on sites put forward for development was taking place between now and January. A number of sites around Cheswick Green have been put forward but currently none are recommended by SMBC.

Chris Nobel has pointed out the increased risk of flooding that would result with some of the sites put forward. Brian has produced a draft copy of a suitable response from the Residents Association that details this and describes village like Cheswick Green as 'Islands in a sea of Green Belt'.

Key points being...

Flooding – Appropriate protection against water run-off must be incorporated within any development.

Green Belt status surrounds Cheswick Green and the neighbouring villages and must be protected. This has been achieved after many years of hard campaigning by residents, Parish Councils and other groups.

The development of any sites within the Green Belt would be inappropriate. It is essential to maintain the village character of Cheswick Green and its neighbouring villages.

Coalescence with other villages and Shirley must be avoided.

It was decided to make some minor amendments to the draft. Brian would pass on to George to submit or response.

AOB

Margaret is updating the list of subs collections for early next year. Brian will be attending a meeting organised by CENTRO on behalf of the RA. Dot had heard that Grosvenor may not continue running the S14 service? Paul reported missing salt/grit boxes in Knoll Croft and Willow Drive – contacting Highways. Margaret reported that new bags for plastic waste were being delivered to houses in Cheswick Green in March.

Mike thought it would be a good idea to have a litter bin at the top of the green by Spinny Drive. Dot to email Mike Gardner at SMBC. Dot reported that the bench in this area was to be moved by the PC.
